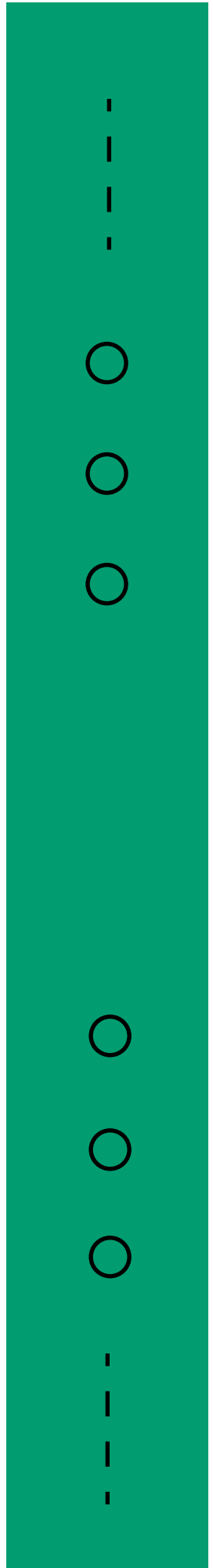
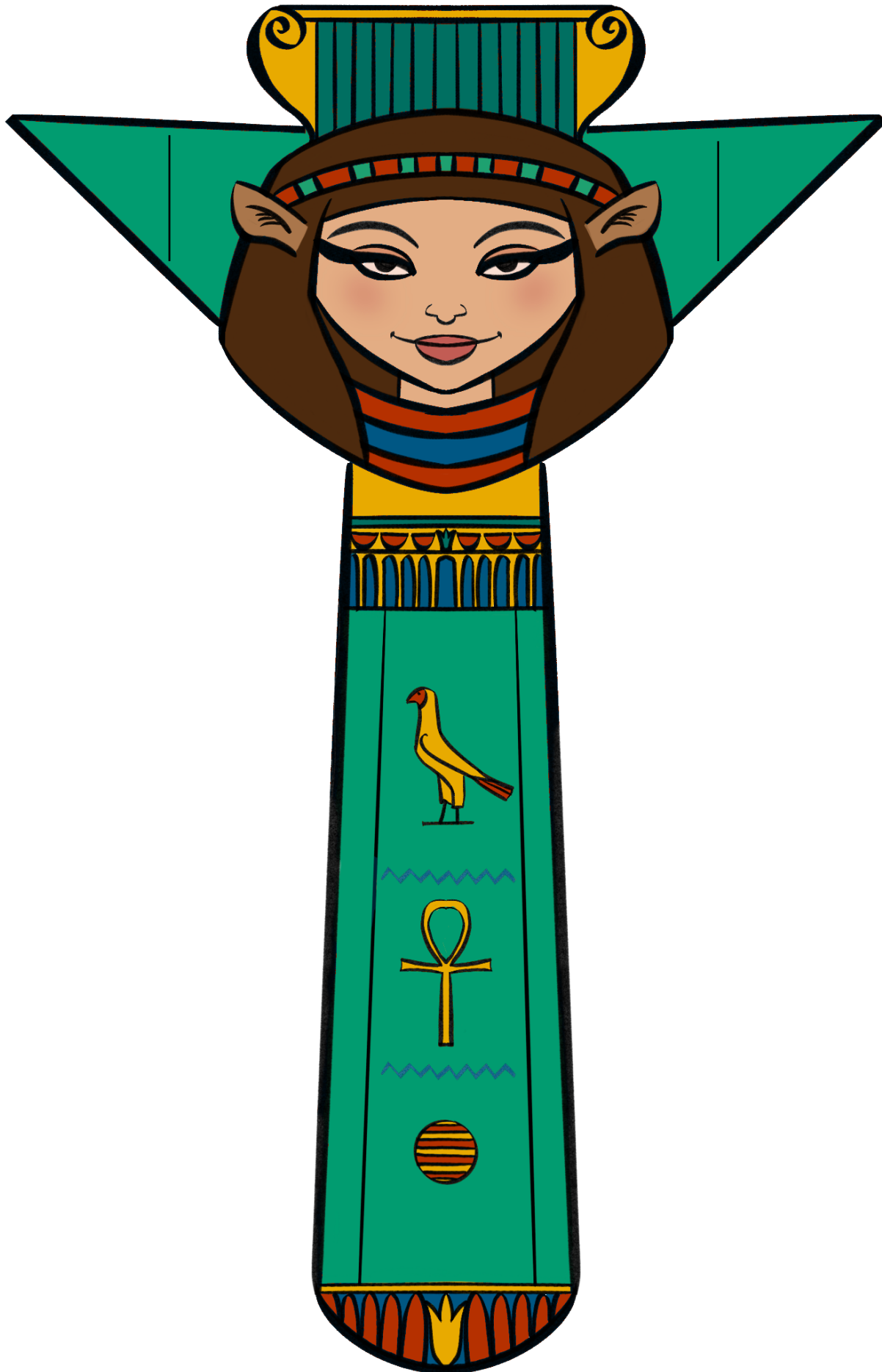


Egyptian Sistrum



The ancient Egyptians used a musical instrument called “sistrum” in religious ceremonies for Hathor, the cow goddess. Let’s make one together!

You will need:

Cardboard

String or wire

Beads, bells, or buttons

Scissors

Instructions

1. Cut the shape out and glue it on cardboard.
2. Make slits along the dotted lines.
3. Pierce the 6 circles.
4. Bend the rectangle and push its sides through the slits into the solid lines.
5. Pass the string through the pierced circles then add the beads.
6. Pass the string through the other pierced circles, and make a knot.
7. Now shake the sistrum to hear a rattling sound.
